Beef and Steer:

What could be done to educate the public about your findings?

Senior: Explain the quality standards that USDA has set for grading rabbit carcasses.

Dairy:

<u>Junior</u>: Explain what the "Dairy Checkoff" is. What is its purpose? How did it come about? <u>Intermediate</u>: Explain how the dairy industry promotes their products. Be sure to give examples and details.

<u>Senior:</u> What organizations play a role in educating the public about the dairy industry? Explain what they are doing.

Poultry:

<u>Junior</u>: Explain the different types of poultry operations that are found in the US. Give details for each.

<u>Intermediate:</u> Explain the role of the U.S. Poultry and Egg Association. How can their role help you as a poultry producer?

<u>Senior:</u> Does the U.S. Poultry and Egg Association provide any educational opportunities to help the general public learn more about the poultry industry? Explain what they do. Give details.

Llama:

<u>Junior</u>: Describe how to evaluate the fleece of your llama. Use specific terminology that a judge would use to describe fleece.

<u>Intermediate:</u> Compare and contrast the Llama fleece and Alpaca fleece. What would each be used for?

<u>Senior:</u> Explain the steps in harvesting the fleece from your animal. What characteristics are you looking for in the fleece? Why are these characteristics important to know?

Dog:

Tell us what breed of dog you are breeding and what steps should be taken to determine if your dog should be bred and have puppies. For example, what are characteristics that conform to the breed standards, and what characteristics do not? What special testing needs to be completed for your breed to ensure as much as possible that the puppies will grow up healthy?
