INTERPRETATION OF RULES

The management of the Florida State Fair reserves the right to amend, add to, and interpret the following Rules and Regulations and to arbitrarily settle and determine all questions and differences in regard thereto or otherwise arising out of, connected with, or incident to the Fair.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

All exhibitors entering this show shall agree to abide by the following rules and regulations.

Each exhibitor entered will be required to bring in their own rabbits upon arrival unless the exhibitor sends in a written request by Jan. 10th. The exhibitor will be notified if permission is granted. Request can be emailed to Ag@FloridaStateFair.com or faxed to 813-740-3520.

ELIGIBILITY

1. Leased animals are not permitted. Anyone leasing animals will forfeit all premiums. All animals must be in the possession, ownership, and care of the exhibitor as of **December 1, 2024**. Per ARBA, an exhibitor must be specified as an individual. Please Note: A chapter can be specified as an exhibitor, but the individual name of the student responsible for the animal must be included.

2. Youth Rabbit Exhibitors must be between the ages of 8 and 18 (as of Sept. 1, 2024). Anyone who has graduated or dropped out of high school is **ineligible** to enter or show.

3. Exhibitors must be present at Rabbit check-in unless special permission has been requested in writing to Emily.Smith@FloridaStateFair.com by January 17, 2025. The Agribusiness Department will notify the

exhibitor if permission is granted.

4. Any exhibitor from a family with an outstanding balance owed to the Fair will not be eligible to show at the Florida State Fair.

Please note: The Florida State Fair will furnish a 16% Rabbit feed that will be fed to all animals while they are cooped in the Rabbit Barn during the 2025 Florida State Fair Youth Rabbit Show.

CHAPTERS/CLUBS PLEASE NOTE: Chapters/Clubs must designate student(s) that will enter and compete in all events. That student will be the representative for the Show, Skillathon, Record Book Skills Test, Showmanship, and all other competitions. The age of the student(s) will determine the division of their competition (Junior, Intermediate, or Senior). Chapters/Clubs must designate student(s) by January 10, 2025 (hand delivered, emailed, faxed, or postmarked – Metered Mail will not be considered as valid or legitimate postmark). **If the name is not received by January 10, 2025, the animal(s) will be allowed to show and compete for animal premiums ONLY.** The Chapter/Club will not qualify for Achievement Premiums or participation in the Champion of Champion program. **All Chapters/Clubs must have a Federal ID number to enter.** The appropriate form is located on the website.

ENTRIES

1. **Entry Due Date - All entries must be hand-delivered or postmarked on or before December 13, 2024. It is the policy of the Florida State Fair to abide by all Rules and Regulations as posted on the Florida State Fair Agribusiness website at www.floridastatefairag.com.**

Entry fee will be determined by the date entries are postmarked or hand-delivered to the Agribusiness Office. Hand-delivered entries will be accepted in the Agribusiness Office up to office closing at 5:00 p.m. on the day of the deadline.

Certified mail or a Certificate of Mailing validated by the Post Office is recommended. A metered postmark will not be considered a valid postmark for entry deadline purposes.

The 1st Late Entry Period for entries postmarked or hand-delivered between December 14 & December 20, 2024, is subject to space availability and will be charged double entry fees.

The Final Late Entry Period for entries postmarked or hand-delivered between December 21, 2024 & January 10, 2025, is subject to space availability and will be charged double entry fees plus a \$100.00 fee (Youth).

2. **All animals must be at least 3 months of age or older.**
3. **If your animal needs tattooing, contact the Show Secretary at Cher2Lyn@gmail.com**

4. **Entry fees for the Youth Rabbit Show categories are \$5.00 for each rabbit and \$5.00 for the Meat Pen. Entry Fees are Non-Refundable.**

5. **The Florida State Fair reserves the right to limit entries based on pen availability. Entries will be accepted in chronological order based on the postmark.**

6. **All changes must be made to the Show Secretary at (941) 920-0961 (call or text) or email Cher2Lyn@gmail.com on or before January 10, 2025. There will BE NO CHANGES made after this date. Substitutions/Changes, if necessary, must be ear number only and being of the same breed, sex, and classification.**

7. **All entries must be made on the Official Florida State Fair Entry Form, which is available on the website. Only one Exhibitor per entry form. Send all entries and fees to Florida State Fair, Youth Rabbit Show, P.O. Box 11766, Tampa, Florida 33680.**

8. **All rabbits entered in the Youth Show must be permanently and legibly tattooed for entry purposes in the left ear before bringing them to the Show Room. Tattooing will not be allowed in the Showroom or on Fairgrounds. Non-compliance with this rule will result in the elimination of the animal from the show and forfeiture of the entry fee. Note: This rule will be strictly enforced.**

9. **FFA Chapters, YLPA Clubs, or 4-H Clubs entering chapter/club animals MUST submit separate entry forms per exhibitor.**

10. **Exhibitors MUST indicate on the Entry Form whether or not they plan to keep their animal(s) at a location other than the home place of the exhibitor or the Land Lab for FFA Chapter animals. Failure to provide this information may result in disqualification.**

11. **Youth exhibitors may also enter the Open Rabbit Show and Cavy Show. Youth exhibitors cannot show rabbits that are entered in the Open Show under another name. A separate entry form and fees must be submitted according to the Open Show rules and regulations (See website for information).**

12. **For Entry Verification purposes, the Fair suggests sending a self-addressed stamped envelope with your entry.**

ASSISTANCE

1. Youth exhibitors are expected to care for, prepare, and show their own animals while on the grounds of the Florida State Fair.

2. Adults (other than parents) or similar unauthorized persons are strictly prohibited from providing direct assistance in the preparation or showing of youth animals while on the grounds of the Florida State Fair.

3. All preparation will be done in a designated area.

4. Exceptions to the above rule must be approved by the committee and be in writing before the Fair.

5. Violations can result in the disqualification of the exhibitor and all premiums, Achievement premiums, etc. will be forfeited.

HEALTH

1. **All animals must meet health requirements as specified in the Rules for Exhibition as required by the Florida Department of Agriculture & Consumer Services.**

2. No sick or diseased stock will be allowed in the Showroom. The Show Superintendent & Asst.

Superintendents have the authority to refuse animals. Every animal must be checked for disease at the check-in table prior to being cooped. Any entry rejected on entry day for sickness, disease, underage, or badly underweight will not be allowed to return to the Showroom during this show.

3. Any rabbit showing signs of disease or pregnancy after arrival will be quarantined and cared for by an experienced rabbit breeder at the owner's expense. The owner will be notified to pick it up.

4. No refunds will be made for rejected animals.

5. **Contact the Florida Department of Agriculture, Animal Industry, District 4 Office at (863) 578-1863 with questions pertaining to Health Regulations and/or Rules of Exhibition.**

GENERAL

1. **Please Note: Due to health and safety issues, no cooking will be allowed in the barns; food and drink should not be consumed in animal areas; and exhibitors should wash their hands after handling animals.**

2. Rabbits may not be bred in the Showroom.

3. Any rabbit that is obviously a crossbreed and does not conform to a Breed Standard will not be accepted in the Showroom.

4. All rabbits entered in meat pens will be cooped in one single coop and will be entered into the Pre-Junior Class with an additional regular entry fee.

5. Rabbits will be fed and watered daily. If your animal requires special feeding, then you must take care of this yourself. Special Do Not Feed signs can be picked up from the Show Secretary when rabbits arrive. Only Florida State Fair signs can be on cages.

6. Only animals being shown at the Florida State Fair are permitted on the Fairgrounds.

7. Any person who violates the general or special rules posted in this premium list will forfeit all privileges and premiums won.

8. **The physical condition of an entrant, which the appropriate committee considers to be a problem for that entrant to participate in the show, may result in the committee not accepting entry or not allowing that entrant to participate in the show.**

9. **Failure to cooperate with Fair Officials may result in premium forfeiture and immediate dismissal from the Fairgrounds.**

10. Smoking is not permitted in the barns.

11. The use of alcohol is prohibited in barns and livestock areas.

12. **No dogs allowed in barns.**

13. **No toys or other paraphernalia in cages with rabbits.**

14. **Hay Cubes will be allowed – 1 cube at a time. Compressed Hay Cubes only.**

ARRIVAL

1. Rabbits will be received on Wednesday, February 5, 2025, between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m. only.

2. All possible care will be taken in receiving, cooping, feeding, caring, and returning animals.

3. Management reserves the right to reject any entry.

4. Exhibitors are expected to feed and water animals once caged.

5. **Rabbit must be in a carrier upon arrival. Rabbit may not**

be handheld.

ADMISSION

1. Each exhibitor will be issued three (3) armbands for the duration of the show. These are intended for use by exhibitors and parents. The exception will be made when more than one exhibitor is from the same family. Any additional exhibitors from the same family will be issued 1 armband.

2. Armbands will be picked up at check-in. Additional armbands CANNOT be purchased. Single day admission tickets can be bought in advance at discount prices. See the Advance Ticket Form on the website for details. Tickets will be for sale at the gate.

3. **Vehicle/Trailer Parking Passes:** All Trailers will be parked in the designated areas within the interior of the grounds. Exhibitors will receive a Vehicle Pass for the duration of the show to be able to park in the Ag Lot outside of Gate 3. Only vehicles with the appropriate tags are permitted in this area.

4. Each passenger must have an armband or admission pass.

5. **Red Gate Drop-Offs Times (This is in addition to arrival):** Vehicles will be allowed to enter through the Red Gate between the hours of 6 am to 10 am and 3 pm to 6 pm to drop-off needed feed and/or supplies. After unloading supplies, vehicles will proceed to the Ag Lot for parking.

6. **Parking Map and Detailed Instructions will be posted on the Agribusiness Website prior to the Fair.**

7. **Reserved parking is provided, and exhibitors must park in the assigned Ag Lot or your vehicle will be subject to towing.**

8. **Champion of Champion Lot: Limited Parking Spaces can be purchased by Exhibitors within the interior of the grounds. All information will be posted on the FSF Agribusiness website. Spaces will open for purchase on January 1st, 2025. All proceeds will go towards the Youth participating in the Champion of Champions program.**

LIABILITY FOR LOSS OR THEFT

1. The owner or custodian of the property of any kind brought to the Fairgrounds, either for exhibit or for other purposes, assumes as a condition of its admission to the grounds all risk and/or responsibility for its loss, damage, or theft.

2. The Fair, its officers, and its employees cannot and will not accept responsibility and liability for any damage, or injury resulting from theft, fire, the elements, accidents, or other conditions or causes; whether to exhibits, property of exhibitor, vehicles on the grounds and articles left therein or any other property of any nature whatsoever.

JUDGING

1. The judging date is February 6 and 7, 2025.

2. **Judging and entry classifications of the American Rabbit Breeders Association will prevail; check A.R.B.A. Standards of Perfection for class and weight.**

3. A remark card with the judge's remarks, special awards, etc., will be posted as soon as possible after the judging.

4. Judges will not award premiums to any article, product, or animal that is not deserving. It must be judged individually worthy.

5. The judge's decision is final, and no appeal will be considered except in cases of written protest (see General Disputes Policy).

6. Any exhibitor who interferes with the judging will be promptly excluded from the competition; if after judging, the premiums awarded will be withheld.
7. All animals must be evaluated by the judge in order to receive premiums.

Please Note: Any rabbit sent home will not be judged but will receive a participation ribbon.

GENERAL DISPUTES POLICY

With respect to any disputes that may occur with respect to an exhibitor at the show, such disputes shall be handled by the appropriate Livestock Committee (the "Committee") in accordance with the following:

1. An exhibitor may file a protest with respect to another exhibitor for violation of the rules and regulations of the Committee and/or the International Association of Fairs and Expositions (IAFE) National Code of Show Ring Ethics by submitting a written protest (a "Protest") on a form (the "Protest Form") which will be available at the Agribusiness Department. The Protest must include the exact basis, cause, and description of the dispute, the name of the protesting exhibitor, the name of the exhibitor being protested, and any materials in support of the Protest as well as any other matters which may be required in the Protest Form and shall be accompanied by payment of \$50 which shall be refunded only if the Protest is sustained by the Committee. The Protest Form must be signed by the exhibitor (as the protesting exhibitor), and if the exhibitor is a minor, the Protest Form must also be signed by the exhibitor's guardian or parent, unless the parent or guardian is not available under circumstances that warrant, as determined by the Agribusiness Department in its sole discretion. Failure to properly sign the Protest Form shall deem the Protest Form incomplete and nullity, and in such an event, the Protest will not be considered. Any Protest must be submitted (and received by the Agribusiness Department) at least two (2) hours prior to the time that the show is scheduled to occur in order to be considered prior to the show. If a Protest is submitted less than two (2) hours prior to the time that the show is scheduled to occur ("a "Late Submittal"), then the Committee will handle the Protest after the show in accordance with its rules and regulations and the IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics, but the Late Submittal shall not affect the award of ribbons for the show. In order to minimize disruption to the show, an exhibitor who intends to file a Protest should do so at the earliest feasible time. In any event, a Protest must be filed with the Agribusiness Department prior to the scheduled release hour for the protested exhibitor's animal in order to be considered.

2. The Agribusiness Department will forward any Protest Form which is duly signed (by an exhibitor as the protesting exhibitor, and if the exhibitor is a minor, the Protest Form must also be signed by the exhibitor's guardian or parent) and any accompanying materials submitted by the protesting exhibitor in support of the Protest to the Committee for its consideration. The Agribusiness Department will also notify the exhibitor being protested of the Protest as soon as reasonably practicable after the Protest has been duly submitted and make available a copy of the written Protest to the exhibitor being protested. The exhibitor being protested may, but shall not be required to, provide a written response to the

Protest (a "Response") by submitting a Response to the Agribusiness Department, including any materials in support of the response to the Protest, and the Agribusiness Department shall provide the Response to Committee. A Response shall be on a form obtained from the Agribusiness Department and must be signed by the protested exhibitor, and if the protested exhibitor is a minor, the Response must also be signed by the protested exhibitor's guardian or parent, unless the parent or guardian is not available due to circumstances that warrant, as determined by the Agribusiness Department in its sole discretion. The Agribusiness Department shall make available a copy of the Response to the protesting exhibitor upon request by the protesting exhibitor, but it shall be the protesting exhibitor's responsibility to monitor the Protest and to obtain a copy of the Response. The Agribusiness Department will attempt to notify the protesting exhibitor and the exhibitor being protested of the time of the Committee's review and consideration of the Protest by calling their respective cell phone numbers if provided on the Protest Form and/or the Response Form, but it shall be the protesting exhibitor and protested exhibitor's responsibility to monitor the Protest and obtain the time of the Committee's review and consideration of the Protest and to be available at the time scheduled for the Committee's consideration of the Protest. For any Late Submission, the Committee will handle the process for review of the Protest after the show.

3. The Committee members present will review the Protest and the Response, if any, in the context of its rules and regulations and the IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics and will make a decision to resolve the Protest by a majority of the Committee members present. In the event of a tie vote, the Protest shall be deemed denied by the Committee. The decision of the Committee will be final.

4. The Committee also may apply and enforce its rules and regulations and the IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics, with respect to exhibitors at the show.

5. By entering the show, all exhibitors, and their respective parents and/or guardians, shall be deemed to have acknowledged and accepted this General Disputes Policy.

PREMIUMS AND AWARDS

1. Premiums will be paid based on the judging reports, which must be signed by the judge and the department superintendent or clerk.

2. Premiums will be mailed to the exhibitor after the Fair to the address given on the entry form. Errors in premium statements will not be corrected after April 1, 2025.

Checks will be void six months from the date on the check. After six months, all uncashed checks will be voided, and replacement checks will not be issued.

3. If a Social Security Number or Federal ID number is not provided, the Fair will not issue a premium check.

4. The management of the Florida State Fair reserves the right to revise the premiums' dollar amount.

SECURITY

1. Members of the Show Committee will be on duty from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m.

RELEASE

1. Rabbits will be released after the announcement of Champion Youth on Monday, February 10, 2025. All

rabbits must be removed by 9 p.m., February 10, 2025, or the exhibitor will forfeit their ownership of the rabbit(s). Release times will be strictly enforced.

2. No animal may be removed from the showroom before 5 p.m., February 10, 2025. Exhibitors violating this rule will forfeit all premiums won, all fees paid, and the right to future participation in the fair. If the Rabbit Show Officials deem it necessary, the entire family member's future entries will be rejected.

3. Animals will be released only to the Youth Exhibitor unless special written permission has been supplied and approved by the Show Superintendent. The letter MUST include the following information –the Exhibitor's Name, Address, Phone number, and the name of the person picking up the animal. The person picking up the animal will need to supply a copy of their photo ID before release is granted. Also, the letter MUST include the Breed, Variety, Tattoo, and Coop# of the animal.

4. **Release Procedure** - Vehicles will not be permitted to line up for release until 4:30 p.m. At that time, vehicles can line up at the security station along the perimeter road. A limited number of vehicles will be allowed behind the barn at a time. As soon as you are finished loading your animals, please move your vehicle so that others can load them out. If you arrive prior to 4:30 p.m., you must park outside the gate until 4:30.

5. Rabbit must be in a carrier upon release. Rabbits may not be handheld.

SALES

1. There will be a minimum sale price of \$20.00.

2. The Show Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent has the authority to screen all animals for sale and disqualify any questionable ones.

3. Animals must meet ARBA Junior minimum weight for each breed and a maximum age of 30 months of age.

4. No rabbits will be sold unless they are entered into the show. The buyer has the option of obtaining a refund if the animal is disqualified.

5. All animals for sale must be specified on a separate sheet of paper.

6. SALES WILL BE HANDLED BY THE SHOW COMMITTEE AT A CHARGE OF 10% PER SALE (10% to go to the Florida State Fair Youth Rabbit Scholarship). All animals sold will receive the Florida State Fair Receipt.

7. A three-generation pedigree must accompany each animal offered for sale upon arrival and each animal must be entered in the show.

8. Release of PURCHASED animals will not be allowed prior to judging. Release after judging will be allowed.

9. A release form must be obtained for the sale of animals.

10. Do NOT send a pedigree or sales sheet to the Florida State Fair. Bring on arrival.

11. All sales will be on a "cash only" basis.

12. Any Youth rabbit for sale and showing in the Open Show, cannot be released until it has shown in the Open Judging.

13. Any exhibitor or their representative discussing sales of their rabbits to interested buyers will be subject to all of their sale animals being removed from sales unless prior permission from the Show Superintendent has been granted. Repeated offense will have the exhibitor subject to

the entire entry removed from competition and premiums forfeited at the discretion of the Sales Committee.

Minimum weight 3.5 pounds each. Maximum weight 5.5 pounds each.

First place trophy, second through fifth place ribbons presented in all classes.

RECORD BOOK - MANDATORY

1. PLEASE NOTE: The Fair will be collecting/judging all the Record Books prior to the Fair. Record Books must be postmarked or hand-delivered on or before January 10, 2025. Please note you must turn in a completed record book to be eligible to compete in the Champion of Champions competition. **NO RECORD BOOKS WILL BE ACCEPTED AT CHECK-IN.** If the Exhibitor is a member of a 4-H Club, YLPA Club, or Agriculture Class, the completed record book must be approved and signed by the 4-H Club Leader, YLPA Representative, or Agriculture Teacher.

2. A Record Book is available on the website, at the seminar, or upon request. **Mail completed record books to: Youth Rabbit Show, Florida State Fair, P.O. Box 11766, Tampa, Florida 33680.**

3. An Online General Record Book is available at <https://fsf.zsuite.org>. Exhibitors can complete the record book online; however, they must still print it off for needed signatures and have it postmarked or hand-delivered on or before **January 10, 2025.**

A tutorial is available on our website on how to create an account and to navigate the online record book.

4. All Record Books will be scored on a basis of 0 - 100 and points will be added to Achievement Premium points.

5. A Record Book is mandatory in order to qualify for Champion of Champions Achievement Premiums. Exhibitors who do not turn in a record book will forfeit all Champion of Champions Achievement Premiums.

6. The Record Book will be returned by mail after the Fair.

RECORD BOOK SKILLS TEST - MANDATORY

1 Exhibitors will be given a Record Book Skills Test. The test will cover all aspects of record keeping on their animal project.

2. Juniors answer junior-designated questions, Intermediates answer Junior- and intermediate-designated questions, and Seniors answer junior, intermediate, and senior-designated questions.

3. The Record Book Skills Test is mandatory in order to qualify for Champion of Champions Achievement Premiums. Exhibitors who do not take the test will forfeit all Champion of Champions Achievement Premiums.

SKILLATHON - MANDATORY

1. A Skillathon will be held in conjunction with the Record Book Skills Test.
2. The Skillathon is a series of "hands-on" stations where students will be asked to perform specific tasks.
3. A Skillathon study guide is available on the website, at the seminar, or upon request.
4. Junior exhibitors only need to do junior-level skills; Intermediate exhibitors only need to do Junior and Intermediate-Level skills. Senior exhibitors must do ALL-level skills.
5. **The Skillathon is mandatory in order to qualify for Champion of Champions Achievement Premiums. Exhibitors who do not participate in the Skillathon will forfeit all Champion of Champions Achievement Premiums.**

EDUCATIONAL POSTER - Optional

Educational Poster may earn 30 points maximum.

1. Exhibitors can earn additional points toward Achievement Premiums by entering an Educational Poster.
2. The purpose of the posters is to educate the public about the animal industry.
3. Posters must be turned in during designated check-in.
4. Posters must be removed during the scheduled release times.
5. **Acceptable poster size:**
 - a. 22" x 28"
 - b. 20" x 30"
6. **Acceptable material for poster:**
 - a. Posterboard
 - b. Foam board
7. No attachments to the poster to extend the acceptable size of the poster.
8. Poster attachments must be within the poster size not exceeding 1' in depth.
9. Posters must relate to the 2025 Skillathon topic of Products and Marketing. Posters are not to be on showmanship.
10. Posters are not to be reused for another animal division in the current year or future years. Once the poster is judged/displayed it is disqualified for additional competition within the current year or future years. Posters are either photographed or marked submitted. The decision of the judge is final.
11. Other requirements:
 - a. Poster must have a title.
 - b. **The poster must have your name and age as of Sept. 1, 2024, on the back in the upper right-hand corner.**
 - c. If the poster is a game/activity it must have instructions and answer key **ON FRONT.**
 - d. If other resources (such as journals or websites) are used, they must be cited on the back of the poster.

13. Posters will be disqualified for:
 - a. Incorrect Poster Size
 - b. Not on current year Skillathon topic
 - c. Plagiarism (use of complete article from web or sourcebook).

VOLUNTEER IN ASK ME BOOTH – Optional

The purpose of the Ask Me Booth is to offer the public an opportunity to meet and speak with Youth Livestock Exhibitors.

1. Exhibitors can earn Achievement Premium points by volunteering in the Ask Me Booth.
2. Exhibitors will utilize Sign Up Genius to sign up for the Ask Me Booth for the 2025 Fair. Registration will be open from January 1, 2025 – January 31, 2025. Times will be selected on a first-come, first-serve basis. Any changes, corrections, or adjustments to the selected time slot may be made online during the active registration time frame or at Arrival/Check-in .
3. **Exhibitors must use their own rabbit. The rabbit must be entered in the Show. Exhibitors without a rabbit entered in the show will not be allowed to participate in the Ask Me Booth.**
4. Exhibitors must complete a one-hour segment in order to earn points.
5. Exhibitors will earn points for their participation.
6. Exhibitors are required to be in Official Show Attire or a current State Fair T-Shirt when manning the booth. Exhibitors must be in blue jeans or long pants, no shorts or flip-flops allowed. Closed-toe shoes **ONLY!** No food or drinks are allowed in the booth.
7. Cell phones need to be silenced and not in use.

SHOWMANSHIP -Optional

1. A Youth Rabbit Showmanship Contest will be held on Saturday, Feb. 8 from 9 a.m. – 3 p.m.
2. **The Written Showmanship Test will be held before the Skillathon on Feb. 6th at:**
 - Seniors – 1 p.m. – 2 p.m.
 - Intermediates – 2 p.m. – 3 p.m.
 - Juniors – 3 p.m. – 4 p.m.
3. Exhibitors will utilize Sign Up Genius to sign up for showmanship for the 2025 Fair. Registration will be open from January 1, 2025 – January 31, 2025. Times will be selected on a first-come, first-served basis. Any changes, corrections, or adjustments to the selected time slot may be made online during the active registration time frame or at Arrival/Check-in .
4. Exhibitors will demonstrate showmanship skills on an individual basis to a judge.
5. **Exhibitors must use their own rabbit. The rabbit must be entered in the Show.**
6. Judging will be on a modified Danish System. All exhibitors will receive a Blue, Red, or White Award. Rosettes will be awarded for the 1st – 4th place in each division.
7. **Cell phones need to be silenced and not in use.**
8. **Age Divisions as of Sept. 1, 2024:**
 - Junior Division (between ages of 8 and 10)
 - Intermediate Division (between ages of 11 and 13)
 - Senior Division (14 and over)
9. Showmanship guidelines can be found on the Agribusiness Website.
10. **In case of a tie for the Top Score, the Top Scores will do a tiebreaker. Tie-breaker time will be announced at the beginning of the contest. Exhibitors must be present.**

ATTIRE

For showmanship, all exhibitors will be required to be clean, neat, and dressed according to the standards of the youth organization they are representing. FFA – Black jeans, white collared shirt, FFA Jacket, and Tie. 4-H – Black/dark jeans, white collared shirt. 4-H vest, jacket, and/or tie are strongly recommended. YLPA – Dark blue jeans, black collared shirt with logo patch. No caps or hats. Closed-toed shoes or boots are required. Exhibitors not conforming to the Dress Code will not be allowed to enter the Show Ring.

YOUTH LIVESTOCK SHOW ETHICS AND ANIMAL CARE WORKSHOP

The Florida State Fair believes that every youth exhibitor should receive proper training and information for raising and showing a youth animal project. It is important that the exhibitor understand:

- The purpose of youth livestock projects
- The importance of ethics in youth livestock projects
- Proper animal handling and management
- The difference between animal welfare and animal rights
- Be prepared to be an ambassador for animal agriculture

The Youth Livestock Show Ethics and Animal Care Workshop is designed to certify students to meet the mandatory certification requirements that will be in effect for the 2025 Florida State Fair. Certification is valid for a three (3) year Fair Season, not 3 calendar years.

For the 2024/2025 Fair Season, Certification Numbers starting with 23, 24, or 25 are current and valid.
The requirements are as follows:

ALL STUDENTS THAT ARE ENTERED IN THE FLORIDA STATE FAIR MUST HAVE COMPLETED THE ETHICS TRAINING TO SHOW AN ANIMAL AT THE 2025 FLORIDA STATE FAIR.

- **THE LAST WORKSHOP OFFERED FOR EXHIBITORS SHOWING AT THE 2025 FLORIDA STATE FAIR WILL BE ON JANUARY 20, 2025.**

This program has been endorsed by the Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services and the University of Florida, Institute of Food and Agriculture Sciences (IFAS).

****Please note: Even though you have attended an Ethics Workshop in the past, your certification number may have expired. Be sure to check your certification number to be sure it is still valid.**

clicking on the Ethics/Verification tab.

QUALITY ASSURANCE PROGRAM

The Florida State Fair believes that every animal participating in activities of the Florida State Fair shall at all times be provided proper care and management in the best interest of the animal's welfare.

1. Quality assurance testing or a survey may be done at the Florida State Fair.
2. All animals are subject to testing at any time:
 - A. To determine whether an animal qualifies for competition in a particular breed classification.
 - B. To determine whether the animal has been unethically fitted in any way.
 - C. To determine whether any false information

or representation was made in a competition entry.

3. Exhibitor's signature on Entry Form acknowledges that they have read and agree to IAFE Code of Show Ring Ethics, (Please note: Rule #4 deals specifically with drugs).
4. Use of drugs, in animals, not in compliance with manufacturer's label as to dosage, time of withdrawal limitations, or other manufacturer's limitations and show regulations are **PROHIBITED**. The use of tranquilizers or possession of same after arrival at the Fair will be construed as tampering.
5. Violators will be disqualified and will forfeit all premiums and awards, including the sale price of animals, if applicable, and future entry of exhibitors and/or family at the Florida State Fair.
6. The use of showing and/or handling practices or devices, using electrical contrivance, or other similar practices that are not recognized as acceptable training, restraint, or animal movement techniques are prohibited.

IAFE (INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF FAIRS AND EXPOSITIONS) NATIONAL CODE OF SHOW RING ETHICS

Exhibitors of animals at livestock shows shall at all times deport themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their conduct in this competitive environment shall always reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of agricultural education. This code applies to junior as well as open-class exhibitors who compete in structured classes of competition. This code applies to all livestock offered in any event at a livestock show. In addition to the "IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics," fairs and livestock shows may have rules and regulations which they impose on the local, county, state, provincial, and national levels.

All youth leaders working with junior exhibitors are under an affirmative responsibility to do more than avoid improper conduct or questionable acts. Their moral values must be so certain and positive that those younger and more pliable will be influenced by their fine example. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers, and absolutely responsible persons who violate the code of ethics will forfeit premiums, awards and auction proceeds and shall be prohibited from future exhibition in accordance with the rules adopted by the respective fairs and livestock shows. Exhibitors who violate this code of ethics demean the integrity of all livestock exhibitors and should be prohibited from competition at all livestock shows in the United States and Canada.

The following is a list of guidelines for all exhibitors and all livestock in competitive events:

1. All exhibitors must present, upon request of fair and livestock show officials, proof of ownership, length of ownership, and age of all animals entered. Misrepresentation of ownership, age, or any facts relating thereto is prohibited.
2. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers, or absolutely responsible persons shall provide animal health certificates from licensed veterinarians upon request by fair or livestock show officials.
3. Junior exhibitors are expected to care for and groom their animals while at fairs or livestock shows.
4. Animals shall be presented to show events where they will enter the food chain free of drugs. The act of entering an animal in a livestock show is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, and/or absolutely responsible person for show management to obtain any specimens of urine, saliva, blood, or other substances from the animal to be used in testing. Animals not entered in an event which culminates with the animal entering the food chain shall not be administered drugs other than in accordance with applicable federal, state, and provincial statutes, regulations, and rules. Livestock shall not be exhibited if the drugs administered in accordance with federal, state, and provincial statutes, regulations, and rules affect the animal's performance or appearance at the event.

If the laboratory report on the chemical analysis of saliva, urine, blood, or other samples taken from livestock indicates the presence of forbidden drugs or medication, this shall be prima facie evidence such substance has been administered to the animal either internally or externally. It is presumed that the sample of urine, saliva, blood, or other substance tested by the approved laboratory to which it is sent is the one taken from the animal in question, its integrity is preserved, and all procedures of said collection and preservation, transfer to the laboratory and analysis of the sample taken from the animal in question and correctly reflects the condition of the animal at the time the sample was taken with the burden on the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to prove otherwise at any hearing in regard to the matter conducted by the fair or livestock show.

At any time after an animal arrives on the fair or livestock show premises, all treatments involving the use of drugs and/or medications shall be administered by a licensed veterinarian.

5. Any surgical procedure or injection of any foreign substance or drug or the external application of any substance (irritant, counterirritant, or irritant substance) which could affect the animal's performance or alter its natural contour, confirmation, or appearance, except external applications of substances to the hoofs or horns of animals which affect appearance only and except for surgical procedures performed by a duly licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal, is prohibited.

6. The use of showing and/or handling practices or devices such as striking animals to cause swelling, using electrical contrivance, or other similar practices are not acceptable and are prohibited.

7. Direct criticism or interference with the judge, fair or livestock show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives, or show officials before, during, or after the competitive event is prohibited. In the furtherance of their official shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation, and respect and no person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them.

8. No owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person shall conspire with another person or persons to intentionally violate this code of ethics or knowingly contribute or cooperate with another person or persons either by affirmative action or inaction to violate this code of ethics. Violation of this rule shall subject such individuals to disciplinary action.

9. The application of this code of ethics provides for absolute responsibility for an animal's condition by an owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or participant whether or not he or she was actually instrumental in or had actual knowledge of the treatment of the animal in contravention of this code of ethics.

10. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to have any disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show for violation of this Code of Show Ring Ethics and any other rules of competition of the fair or livestock show without recourse against the fair or livestock show. The act of entering an animal is the giving consent that any proceedings or disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show may be published with the name of the violator or violators in any publication of the International Association of Fairs and Expositions, including *Fairs and Expositions* and any special notices to members.

11. The act of entering of an animal in a fair or livestock show is the giving of verification by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person that he or she has read the IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics and understands the consequences of and penalties provided for actions prohibited by the code. It is further a consent that any action which contravenes these rules and is also in violation of federal, state, or provincial statutes, regulations, or rules may be released to appropriate law enforcement authorities with jurisdiction over such infractions.

FLORIDA STATE FAIR AUTHORITY LIVESTOCK ADDENDUM

Neither AUTHORITY nor such applicable Show Committee shall be liable to OWNER, or any officer, agents, employees, trainers, drivers, riders, handlers, or other contractors, invitees, or guests of OWNER for any injury or damage to livestock, person, or property. AUTHORITY, its officers, or agents, assume no liability for any loss or damage to property (including but not limited to livestock) on account of fire, theft, or any other cause including infectious or contagious diseases. In addition, OWNER acknowledges receiving and agrees to abide by the applicable rules and regulations of the AUTHORITY titled FLORIDA STATE FAIR LIVESTOCK RULES & PRIZE LIST, and same are incorporated by reference herein.
