Florida State Fair Ag Mechanics Show Rules

The purpose of the FSF Ag Mechanic Show

- To provide an opportunity for Florida 4-H, FFA, and YLPA members to display projects constructed in agricultural mechanics labs and/or at home under the supervision of an Agriculture Teacher, 4-H Leader, or YLPA Representative.
- To promote the development of skills in agricultural mechanics through competition.
- To recognize individual accomplishments in the area of agricultural mechanics.
- To provide an opportunity for public appreciation of this important phase of Florida Youth Programs.

Rules:

- 1. Only Florida residents who are bona fide 4-H or YLPA members (8 years old or older as of Sept. 1, 2025) or FFA members will be eligible to enter. All entrants must be currently active in the 4-H or YLPA Club program or the Vocational Agricultural Program in Florida.
- 2. Anyone having currently graduated from or dropped out of high school or currently enrolled in an Agriculture Class but not attending class shall be ineligible to show. Both FFA Chapter, YLPA Club, and 4-H Club entries will be accepted. Chapters and Clubs must be valid clubs and in good standing with their local & state organizations.
- **3.** Entry Application Due Date All entries must be submitted online on or before January 12, 2026. It is the policy of the Florida State Fair to abide by all Rules and Regulations as posted on the Florida State Fair Agribusiness website at www.floridastatefairag.com. No Paper Entries will be accepted.
- **4.** There is a \$10.00 Entry Fee per project. Payments will be accepted online at the time of entry. Entry Fees are Non-Refundable.
- **5.** Projects must have been constructed by the youth exhibitor who entered them.
- 6. Projects may be built of either wood or metal only. Extra products can be added (i.e. shingles) if necessary for the project but will not be accounted for in the judging process.
- 7. Projects should be built from either published drawings or drawings of original design.
- **8.** Projects exhibited must have been constructed by FFA students, 4-H, or YLPA Members either as a part of their agricultural mechanic's instruction in vocational agriculture or as part of a supervised work experience program or project.
 - No exhibitor may enter more than four (4) projects in total.
 - Exhibitors are allowed to enter 2 projects per class.
 - Substitution of projects will not be allowed.
 - Exhibit space and location will be at the Florida State Fair Staff and Superintendents' discretion.
- **9.** Projects must have been constructed within **a year prior to delivery** (for example, January 1, 2025 December 31, 2025). A project can be exhibited only once at the Florida State Fair.
- 10. All projects must be clean, painted, or properly treated and in a presentable condition even though they have been used. Articles designed to be hung should have a hanging method attached (wire, bracket, etc.).
- 11. If a project is entered in the wrong division, it will be scored but will not be eligible for Grand Champion or Reserve Champion. NOTE: Judges will make the final determination of proper classification.
- 12. Every precaution will be taken to protect the projects entered, however neither the Florida State Fair, its directors, superintendents nor judges will be responsible for any losses or damage to projects.
- **13.** The Florida State Fair reserves the right to display projects as space and quality allow. Due to space availability, projects may be located at various locations within the Fairgrounds area.
- 14. All judge's decisions and announced results will be final.
- **15.** Once the project is delivered, it cannot be removed or used until it has been released from the show. Projects can be picked up on Tuesday, February 18th, from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. and Saturday, February 22nd, from 9 a.m. to 12 noon. You must contact the Agribusiness Department to make any other arrangements for pick up.
- **16.** Exhibitors will receive two admission passes to attend the Fair. If participating in Showmanship, exhibitors will be given two additional admission passes for Saturday, February 7th

- 17. The management of the Florida State Fair reserves the right to amend, add to, and interpret the following Rules and Regulations and to arbitrarily settle and determine all questions and differences in regard thereto or otherwise arising out of, connected with, or incident to the Fair.
- **18.** The Fair reserves the right to limit the number of animals based on the availability of pen space. Entries will be accepted in chronological order based on the postmark.



- 19. Participants MUST complete a Florida State Fair Ag Mechanic Project Record Book for each entry. Project Record Books will be collected on Delivery Dates with projects. Showmanship

A Showmanship Division will be held on Saturday, February 7th, 2026, from 11 am to 12 pm for exhibitors who would like to participate. This is an optional event but an exciting way to talk to the judges and public about your project. Showmanship Winner Announcements will be held at 1 pm on Saturday, February 7th.

Showmanship will be divided into Junior, Intermediate, and Senior age divisions.

- Exhibitors will be required to be clean, neat, and dressed according to the standards of the youth organization they are representing. FFA Black jeans, white collared shirt, FFA Jacket and Tie. 4-H Black/dark jeans, white collared shirt. 4-H vest, jacket, and/or tie is strongly recommended. YLPA Dark blue jeans, black collared shirt with logo patch. No caps or hats. Closed-toed shoes or boots are required.
- Exhibitors should be courteous and helpful to those viewing their project.
- Exhibitors should be prepared to answer questions when their project is being viewed either by the judge or fairgoers. Knowledge of the project will be evaluated at that time. Exhibitors should be well-informed about the project they are representing.

Prizes/Awards will be awarded for $1^{st} - 3^{rd}$ place showmen in each Age division.

Exhibitors can register for Showmanship during the online entry process.
